

Bryan City Council Ironing Out Final Details of BioMedical Corridor Agreement

The Bryan City Council has still not voted on an agreement with [College](#) Station and Texas A&M to join forces in expanding the BioMedical Corridor.

They wrapped up an executive session late Wednesday night after meeting behind closed [doors](#) most of the afternoon.

They also held a public hearing on a proposal for the corridor near Highway 47 and [University](#) Drive Wednesday.

The cities would split the costs of water, sewer and other [infrastructure](#), and would also share property tax revenue on the land in question.

We're told the city attorney is making a few changes to the agreement.

"I mean it's really a neat thing when the community comes together behind a unified effort and this one just happens to be a tremendous economic opportunity for our community," said Chris Peterson, Research Valley Partnership [Board of Directors](#) Chairman-Elect.

The Bryan City Council is expected to vote on the issue during their next meeting Tuesday, the 24th
