

Fee Agreement for Initial Consultation

In your initial consultation, you and the attorney will identify the type of case you have, the key issues, and the options you may have under law. You and the attorney will discuss whether the firm will represent you, what the representation could involve, and the amount of the initial deposit that would be required.

The firm charges \$200.00 for an initial consultation. You may pay in cash, by certified funds, or by credit/debit card. You must sign this agreement and pay the initial consultation fee by using the this link: <https://secure.lawpay.com/pages/gradneyprc/operating> before receiving any professional services.

At the conclusion of the initial consultation, the attorney can provide you with a contract for legal services and with client information questionnaires. If you or the attorney fail to sign this contract for legal services, an attorney-client relationship between you and the firm will not extend beyond the initial consultation. However, any communications you make to the attorney during the initial consultation are protected by the attorney-client privilege.
